

Linaise and Rebecca are committed not only to the recovery of their country, but also to the health and care of the people in Haiti.

At the start of Global Adolescent Project (G.A.P.), Linaise slept huddled in a tent every night. She was not enrolled in school for a year before she met us and started helping out around the house with cooking and taking care of the younger kids. Her dedicated and helpful nature that is visible in her work at G.A.P., is needed in a woman who aims to care for Haiti's citizens—many of whom have faced unspeakable, and unfortunately familiar, trauma during the last two years. Linaise is now ready to assist others in order to give back to her community.

Rebecca was raised by her mother and was in nursing school at the time of the 2010 earthquake. Luckily, she was able to escape her school building that claimed so many of her

friends' lives. That same day, her mother was killed by the collapse of her doctor's office. She travelled to the Dominican Republic last year in an effort to go back to nursing school and support herself, but when faced with more hardships there, she moved back to Haiti into the G.A.P. house. G.A.P. was able to support her and she soon began assisting Dr. Nancy Sobel with trauma counseling and lessons concerning healthy relationships.

Both Linaise and Rebecca have their first year of Nursing school behind them and they are eager to continue onto year two, but we need your help.
